After months of planning, fundraising, and rehearsing, on December 31, under the guidance of Band Director Meredith Rhodes-Lundgren and ten chaperones, the band and color guard left the high school at 3:30 am to board their flight to Florida. The group included a total of eighty-one travelers.

For the twelfth time since 1981, the Amery High School Band embarked on a major trip to showcase their talent, represent Amery, enjoy new and unique experiences, and of course, have fun. Every four years the high school band has traveled across the country to perform at theme parks, bowl games, parades, and other iconic locations. By planning a trip every four years, every high school student in band has the opportunity to participate.

Over the past forty-four years, the band has proudly represented small-town Amery, WI in California, Florida, New York City, Washington DC, Texas, and Georgia.

This year's trip included air travel, a day at the ocean, visits to Universal Studios and Hollywood Studios, and an incredible day at Walt Disney World's Magic Kingdom, where they marched and performed for thousands of onlookers on Main Street USA. On the day they marched, Magic Kingdom was sold out to over 100,000 guests.

According to Rhodes-Lundgren, the entire marching experience can be summed up in a single word: PRIDE. "When we were warming up, we were under the roofed, outdoor deck area. As we did a runthrough, I watched the students play their hearts out. The acoustics of the space made us sound like a college group. I looked around and thought, these kids are incredible. I was so proud."



It was pouring rain as they were waiting to go backstage, and not one student complained. The kids were soaking wet in ponchos that didn't provide much protection. Rather than disappointment, the kids laughed and asked if they were still marching. Rhodes-Lundgren assured them that if Disney allowed it, they were going to march; they were not afraid of rain.

The rain stopped, and they marched as planned! "I was so proud," said Rhodes-Lundgren. "I looked around to my student's faces, whose eyes were lit up with joy and darting around to take in the moment. I then looked over at the crowds who were in awe of us - thousands of people recording and cheering for us. We were marching by the Disney Castle lit up at night, and the streets were lined with holiday lights. What more could you ask for?"

For many students, this was their first time on an airplane, their first journey beyond the Midwest, their first time traveling without their families, their first time seeing and swimming in the ocean, and their first time visiting a major theme park. They made unforgettable memories!



The band is grateful for the support from the Amery Band Boosters, the school district, the Amery Board of Education, the band parents, and the Amery-area community for making this incredible experience possible for them.

The Amery Band Boosters raised over \$72,000 for this trip, thanks to various fundraising events backed by the community. Thank you!

Rhodes-Lundgren said, "I always tell my bands, we are family. I know after this AMAZING band trip, that our band family (students, chaperones, and all others who attended this trip) are a lot closer."

## 6th & 7th Grade Technical Education Students are Hands-On

In sixth grade, students learn how something is made and how to read a ruler while crafting their own cutting boards in their six-week Technology Education class. In addition to making the cutting board, students select a piece of artwork and text to engrave on the board using the middle school CNC router. The engraving is filled with colorful epoxy, and the students complete the project by sanding and finishing the board with mineral oil.

In seventh grade Technology Education, students turn into mini carpenters as they whip up wooden phone stands. They begin by tracing the parts onto the stock using a template. Next, they utilize both the drill press and band saw to cut out the template, followed by gluing and finishing the stands.
















#### Children who do not live in the School District of Amery can attend Amery Schools

What is Open Enrollment?

The public school open enrollment program allows parents to apply for their children to attend public school in a school district other than the one in which they reside.



#### Who can apply?

Any WI resident in 4K-grade 12 may apply to attend a nonresident school district. However, a child may transfer to a nonresident school district for early childhood education or 4K only if the child's resident school district offers the same type of program and only if the child is eligible for that program in the resident school district.

#### When can parents apply?

The regular application period for the 2025-26 school year ends at 4pm on April 30, 2025. The best way to apply is online using the URL link provided below and on the School District of Amery website Enrollment page.

An alternative application procedure allows pupils to apply for open enrollment at any time during a school year if certain criteria are met.

Highlighted in this newsletter is the strong performance of the School District of Amery on the state-mandated district report card. For over a decade, our district has 'Exceeded Expectations' on the state report card. Leading the way this year was the performance of Amery Middle School which 'Significantly Exceeded Expectations' and was honored nationally in November as a 2024 Blue Ribbon School.

We are also featuring the successful AHS Band trip to Florida, the Lien Elementary 'Masked Reader' reading incentive program, the hands-on Technology Education projects at the Middle School, and a great Career Day event at the Intermediate School. Though we feature these things here, we all know that there is so much more that happens every day in our classrooms and before and after school; we are incredibly proud of all our students, staff, and their successes.

We are moving into the winter athletics playoff season with high hopes for tournament runs for boys and girls hockey, basketball, and wrestling. The AHS Dance team qualified for state competition in Hip Hop, and we have had a great season of team and individual victories: boys hockey heads into the conference tournament and playoffs as the #1 seed in both; girls hockey is the #2 seed for playoffs; three individual wrestlers are in the state rankings; senior Carter Wollan has become Amery's all-time leading scorer in basketball and exceeded 2,000 points; Luciana Aizpurua has exceeded the 1,000 point milestone in girls basketball; senior Lane Andersen has surpassed 150 victories in his high school wrestling career; and junior Jacob Maxon has scored over 100 points in his hockey career. It's a great time to be an Amery Warriors fan!

As part of the state accountability system, the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction (DPI) produces Report Cards for every publicly funded school and district in Wisconsin. #### LIEN ELEMENTARY SCHOOL Grades 4K-2

- There are no mandated standardized tests at the elementary level. Instead, the elementary school receives an 'Alternative Rating' (AR).
- Lien Elementary uses FastBridge, an assessment tool to determine areas of growth and to plan for student needs. The FastBridge benchmark scores are determined three times per year and help drive lesson planning and interventions necessary to develop student skills.



#### AMERY INTERMEDIATE SCHOOL Grades 3-5

- EXCEEDS EXPECTATIONS for the eleventh consecutive year.
- Exceeds the state in English/Language Arts by 10.3 points.
  - Exceeds the state in Math by 12.5 points.
- The Math Growth score exceeds the state Math Growth score by 9.5 points.



#### AMERY MIDDLE SCHOOL Grades 6-8

- SIGNIFICANTLY EXCEEDS EXPECTATIONS and has Exceeded or Significantly Exceeded Expectations for eleven consecutive years.
- The overall score of 92.6 is the ninth highest of ALL Wisconsin middle schools (top 2%).
- The overall score is the HIGHEST of ALL CESA 11\* middle schools.
- The overall score is the HIGHEST in the Middle Border Conference.
- The overall Growth score is the HIGHEST of all Wisconsin middle schools.

Amery Middle School is a 2024 National Blue Ribbon School!

This prestigious recognition highlights select schools nationwide that excel in academic performance or make significant strides in closing achievement gaps.

Amery was 1 of only 356 schools recognized nationwide and 1 of 8 in Wisconsin.



#### AMERY HIGH SCHOOL Grades 9-12

- Ninth grade pre-ACT composite scores are the HIGHEST in the Middle Border Conference.
- Overall Achievement scores are in the top 59% of the state.
- The Achievement score is 15th highest of 39 schools in CESA 11\*.
- The participation rates for post-secondary preparation and arts far exceed the state rates in almost every area (see below).

**ADVANCED** PLACEMENT 106 students (23.4%)successfully completed at least one Advanced Placement course. Amery 68.4% State 25.7%




## ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT Forward Exam

The Wisconsin Forward Exam is designed to gauge how well students are doing in relation to the Wisconsin Academic Standards. These standards outline what students should know and be able to do in order to be college and career ready.

The Forward Exam is administered online in the spring of each school year to grades 3-8 in Reading/Language Arts and Math, grades 4 and 8 in Science, and grades 4, 8 and 10 in Social Studies.

## BEYOND Classroom Walls and BEYOND Test Scores

**Career and Technical Education Academies (CTE)** at the high school prepare students for careers that reflect the contemporary workplace. CTE Academies are offered in the areas of Construction, Agriculture, Catering, and Entrepreneurship. In the Construction Academy, students have built and sold five houses and will complete a sixth after the 25-26 school year! Additional lots of land have been purchased so students can continue participating firsthand in the entire process of building a house.



Youth Apprenticeship and Work-Based Learning opportunities in abundance for high school students.



An annual, two-day **environmental education trip** for all 5th grade students where they experience the diverse, rich, and unique region in which we live.



A variety of **extra-curricular opportunities** helping students develop skills such as leadership, teamwork, time management, and social interaction, while also allowing them to explore interests:

- 17 WIAA high school athletic opportunities
- 7 middle school athletic opportunities
- Marching Band, Jazz Band, Jazz Choir
- A number of clubs & organizations including Dance Team, Powerlifting, Theatre, FFA, Forensics, and more.



Abundant outdoor spaces on the school campus include a school forest, classroom shelters, wetland, a lake, a prairie, and a vegetable garden. Students learn about forestry, tap maple trees, plant and harvest vegetables, manage an apple orchard, plant trees, monitor bluebirds, study water quality, practice survival skills, snowshoe, and hike.



**The F.A.R.M.** is a 35-acre parcel of land adjacent to the school campus for real-life expansion of hands-on agriculture education. Current projects include growing and harvesting corn and alfalfa, planting Christmas trees with kindergarten students who will get to harvest a tree and take it home when they are in high school, raising honey bees, and creating a corn maze. Future plans include an orchard, vegetable gardens, spaces to raise animals and train horses, a school farm classroom, and a school farm store.



**Hands-on** high school classes where students spend significant time outside the classroom including Horsemanship, Landscaping, Freshwater Ecology, and Outdoor Adventure Education.

**TRADITIONAL CLASSROOMS:** Amery's Traditional classrooms are available to all children in 4K Preschool through Grade 12. These classrooms utilize a variety of innovative teaching tools allowing students to engage within a balance of choice activities, projects, small groups, integrated technology, exploration, and more.

**MONTESSORI**: The Montessori philosophy of education is based on self-directed activity, hands-on learning, and collaborative play. Students make creative choices in their learning while the classroom and the teacher offer age-appropriate activities to guide the process.

Amery offers Montessori as a multi-age option at the following levels:

- Children's House for 4K Preschool & Kindergarten
- Lower Elementary for Grades 1-3
- Upper Elementary for Grades 4-5

All children are unique in how they learn, develop, and grow.

**COLLEGE AND CAREER READY:** Amery High School offers several programs to ensure students are college and career ready:

- Advanced Placement (AP) courses, additional Advanced Offerings, and Dual Enrollment college credit courses.
- Youth Apprenticeship, Industry-Recognized Credentials, Work-Based Learning, and Embedded Technical Diplomas.

**CAREER & TECHNICAL EDUCATION (CTE) ACADEMIES:** CTE Academies are offered in the high school in Construction, Agriculture, Catering and Entrepreneurship. Students in the academies earn college credits and industry-recognized credentials. Many of the academy students are also in the Youth Apprenticeship program developing valuable workplace skills.

**THE CLUBHOUSE** provides quality care for infants, toddlers and school-age children in 4K through Grade 5. It is a safe, supervised, enriching environment for all children. The Clubhouse is conveniently located in the elementary school and is recognized by Polk County as a reimbursable childcare provider through the Wisconsin Shares program. The Clubhouse provides infant and toddler childcare year-round, before and after school care for 4K through Grade 5 students during the school year, and a summer day camp for 4K through Grade 5 students.
