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Notes from the principal's desk

I hope you all enjoy the upcoming holiday season. We are excited to be closing out the first half of the school year, and we are pleased with how hard students have worked this year. In this newsletter you will find some important dates coming up in the next two months that I want to bring to your attention:



Second Trimester: We are busy with the start of our second trimester. Students have started their second set of classes and their third applied arts class.

First-Semester Reward Day: First-semester reward day is schedule for Friday, Jan. 31, 2025. Students who do not receive more than five Level 2 and/or 3 infractions over the length of the entire semester are eligible for the off-campus reward options. We are still working on plans for reward day, and a form will be distributed to students soon. In the past, we have held events such as skating at the Amery Ice Arena, skiing or tubing at Trollhaugen, bowling, etc.

Freshman Registration Night: To help our students transition from 8th to 9th grade, we will be holding the freshman registration night the evening of Monday, Feb. 3, 2025, at Amery High School. More information will be provided on this event at a later date. This registration session is for all 8th-grade students and their parents. In the past, parents and students had the opportunity to learn more about the high-school schedule, how the high school operates, what classes students must take, what classes students can choose from, and how the high-school credit system works. It is our goal for parents and students to leave the registration night with a general understanding of what courses they must take now so that they are better prepared to meet their personal goals and objectives. Students will also be receiving their high-school class registration forms at this meeting

Parent/Teacher Conferences: Our second set of Parent/Teacher Conferences will be held on Monday, Feb. 10, from 4 to 8 PM and on Thursday, Feb. 13, from 1 to 8 PM. Again, the format for conferences will be in-person as well as remote options like we had last fall.

Forward Exam: Students at Amery Middle School will take the Forward Exam the week of April 7-11. In addition, 8th-grade students will have testing April 2-3. More information on the Forward Exam will come at a later date.
